She is also a charter member of the Women of Color Empowerment Institute and has previously served as an officer for Leadership Florida, the North Broward County Chapter of the Links, Inc., the Fort Lauderdale Chapter of Jack and Jill, the Broward County Community Action Agency, Legal Services of Greater Miami and the Wilkie D.
